We have arranged a morning visit to the Abu Dhabi Wildlife Centre, which is very close to Al Wathba Wetland Reserve, **on Saturday 18th April 2015 at 10 a.m.** The A.D. Wildlife Centre is "a non-profit rescue and rehabilitation centre to ensure the continued survival and well-being of **endangered species**. The Centre provides sanctuary for orphaned and sick animals from the largest mammals to the smallest antelope. Raising public awareness of the urgent need for wildlife preservation is an integral part of the centre. The Centre focuses on the breeding of Cheetah, Tigers, Lions, Ocelot, Caracals, Leopards, Servals and Jaguars. "

Entry to the Wildlife Centre is Dh70/- per adult and Dh40/- per child under 12 years.

The Environment Agency of Abu Dhabi has again kindly offered to host the DNHG at Al Wathba Wetland Reserve and this will take place, early Saturday afternoon, after our visit to the Wildlife Centre. This will offer an excellent opportunity to learn more about the reserve in addition to seeing the flamingos plus other migrating birds that are wintering or en-route through Abu Dhabi.
